

For you first timers, please ask any questions you may have regarding camping in the off season. Our staff is here to help with all your questions, whether it's camping concerns, RV service needs, or who won the game last night. November 23rd will be our last Saturday open until March 1st. With that being said, make sure to get your LP filled Monday thru Friday 8am-5pm. You can call for us to fill it and pay over the phone with a credit card if that is more convenient for you. If anyone is interested in one of our sales units and Saturday is your only option, please give Sales Manager, Isaac Combs, a call and he will set up a meeting with you. If you haven't heard the news yet, we regret to inform you that we will no longer be handling mail for monthly campers. I understand that this causes an inconvenience for many of you, but due to privacy issues, we are no longer able to provide this service. Please check surrounding post offices, or one of the nearby postal stores for available PO Boxes. After January 1st, all customer mail will be returned and the boxes in the camp office will be taken down.

Thank you for getting your mail forwarded ASAP. Now I would like to go over a few things that always seem to pop-up during the winter months. Please pay attention to this message so we can try to stop craziness before craziness happens. First, please take care of the restrooms. These facilities are here for all of you to take advantage of and need to be maintained by all. Please refrain from leaving messes, and if you make a mess that is too much for you to get, please let us know. Next, Speeding! Please keep your speed at the posted 5mph limit. There are campers at our full-hook-up sites with children that you all need to be aware of. FYI... the speed limit starts and stops at the road. We will be turning the water off to the campsites on November 19th unless we see some colder weather coming sooner. Please fill all tanks that need filled by then. Once the water is off, we will have a hose, just inside the men's restroom door that you can use, provided that it is rolled up and put back in its place when you are finished. If not, you will have to supply your own hose to reach the spicket.
